




#### 9 billion people will live on earth by 2050!

- What are possible benefits and contributions of plant science?




### 67% of the world population will live in cities by 2025!

World chemicals sales: geographic breakdown






- \* Rest of Europe covers Switzerland, Norway, Turkey, Russia and Ukraine

EU share of global chemicals market








### Nearly two-thirds of EU chemicals are supplied to the industrial sector



# Introducing Cefic: the voice of the chemical industry in Europe




- Based in Brussels since 1972










- Deepen our understanding of KPIs



  - ✓ Circular Economy etc.
